C = Start in flats in cold frame.

D = Direct seed (If item not marked with "D," start in flats and transplant 4 weeks later)

G = Start in greenhouse. Move to cold frame, then to field.

O = Start outside in flats.

S = Germinate under shade cloth. In two or three weeks move under midday shade tarp. (See note #1.)

> = You can continue planting these weeks if weather is still mild.

#1 = Starting in June protect seedlings (still in flats) with shade tarp from 12 noon – 3 P.M. during high temperatures. You can utilize overhead water to help cool seedlings the first couple of days after transplant.

#2 = Provide good moisture during germination. Once cotyledons appear, water from below if possible (set flats into a tub). To avoid dampening off, water only if necessary during the first few days true leaves appear.

Optimal time for sowing is the week before the full moon or the week before the new moon. Consult the Stella Natura Calendar for the appropriate root/leaf/flower/fruit day.

Seeds planted in flats should be transplanted into the ground after approximately one month. (3-6 weeks depending on development.)

Transplant after 4 P.M., water roots well (don't use overhead watering immediately after transplanting).

In spring and starting again with fall's cold nights, water in the morning. In summer, water in the evening.
